William Faulkner has been playing mariachi for 39 years, and Jalisco harp for 34. William's love affair with the harp began in 1977, shortly before graduating from U.C. Berkeley with a degree in music. In 1981 he began studying harp with Arturo Mendoza (harpist with Mariachi Vargas from 1945-1995) and in 1982 He traveled to Zapotiltic, Jalisco to meet Arturo's father, José Mendoza who was a noted harp soloist in the tradition of southern Jalisco. Inspired by José Mendoza, William began playing solo harp as well as continuing to play harp with Mariachi Mixtlán, which he directed from 1980 to 1998.

In the ensuing years William has played with various other mariachis, notably Mariachi International America and Mariachi Cobre, and has accompanied such artists as Cuco Sanchez, Federico Villa, Juan Valentín, Vikki Carr, Linda Ronstadt and others. As a soloist, William has performed throughout Jalisco, including Guadalajara, Ajijic, Atequiza, Autlán, Chapala, Ciudad Guzmán, Cocula, El Grullo, Ixtlahuacán de los Membrillos, Lagos de Moreno, Mezquitic, Ocotlán, Sayula, Tequila, Tlajomulco de Zuñiga, Tlaquepaque, Tonalá, Tototlán, Zapotiltic, Zapotlanejo and others. He is currently the "Arpista Municipal" of Tequila, Jalisco. In 2014 Zapotiltic, Jalisco made him an adopted son.
